

Daniel Gaudry, DVM (USA-France)

Daniel Gaudry has been the Secretary of the International Alliance for Biological Standardization since 1985.

Development and Management

In 1968, Dr. Gaudry started his career at Institut Mérieux, Lyon, France. He was instrumental in the development and the management of the avian product line at Institut Mérieux, then Rhône Mérieux, and finally Merial, both of which derived from Institut Mérieux. Among Dr. Gaudry's professional milestones was the set-up and initial development of the company's U.S. veterinary subsidiary in Athens, Georgia in the 1980s. Since that time, the company has grown to become a major player in the veterinary field in the U.S. During his years at Rhône Mérieux, Dr. Gaudry succeeded in obtaining the first USDA-approved rabies vaccine for use by the subcutaneous route, a significant accomplishment in the field of veterinary medicine in the U.S.

In 1981, on the recommendation of Dr. Charles Mérieux, Dr. Gaudry was elected member of the IABS Board of Directors. From 2008 to 2010, Dr. Gaudry served as President while continuing his function as Secretary of the Alliance.

Dr. Gaudry received his Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine (DVM) at the Ecole Nationale Vétérinaire de Toulouse and subsequently specialized in immunology and obtained a degree from the Université de Lyon in 1969.

For several years, Dr. Gaudry was the French Secretary at the World Veterinary Poultry Association (WVPA). He is currently the Secretary of the Poultry Veterinary Study Group for Europe.

Dr. Gaudry has American and French dual citizenship and spends his time between France & U.S.
